INTERNATIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

TWU is recognized under the B.C. Ministry of Advanced Education's Education Quality Assurance (EQA) designation for providing quality post-secondary education.

GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION

Students must have standing in five subjects of which at least two must be taken at the Advanced level.

Students may be eligible for three semester hours of credit for each Advanced level course completed to a maximum of 12 semester hours provided that a minimum grade of C is achieved in that course. Departments will determine if credit awarded is general or course specific.

The following equivalents will be considered:

- 1. School Certificate: same as GCE with at least two passes at the principal level of the Higher School Certificate.
- 2. Certificate of matriculation from recognized universities.
- 3. International Baccalaureate with at least two subjects at the higher level.
- 4. Other countries: write or email the Admissions Office for information.

DOCUMENTS

Official supporting documentation must be submitted. Documents that cannot be replaced should be sent via registered mail.

Items submitted to TWU Admissions become property of Admissions at Trinity Western University and will not be returned under any circumstances.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENT FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

English is the language of instruction at TWU. All applicants must demonstrate English Language Proficiency in both oral and written academic English.

Language Requirements

- •GXP Online program IELTS requirement is 6.0 (no bands less than 5.5)
- •GXP Online program Duolingo: overall score of 100 109
- •Traditional face to face IELTS requirement is 6.5 (no bands less than 6.0)
- •Traditional face to face Duolingo: overall score of 110+

- •Attending TWU's language pathway program: TLC
- •IB: A1 or A2 English 3 or above
- •Complete three consecutive years of full-time high school or post-secondary education in English within Canada or approved countries immediately prior to enrolment at TWU.

Academic requirements

•Completion of high school with an average of 70% in academic courses

OR

- •Or IB: 24 or above in total
- •Or A-levels (Cambridge GCE, Pearson, EDEXCEL)
- -3 A-levels C or above, or
- -2 A-levels plus 2 AS-levels C or above, or
- -4 AS level C or above
- •Or graduate from high school or equivalent with a university preparatory program: must include English 12 plus four additional Grade 12 academic subjects at a minimum overall average of 70%

Here are the eight ways to meet TWU's English Language Proficiency Requirement:

1. Submit official TOEFL, IELTS, Cambridge English Qualifications, PTE Academic, CAEL, or Duolingo exam results, meeting the admission requirements in the table below. Test results are valid for admission to TWU for up to two years from the examination date. Tests taken more than two years prior will not be valid for admission. These results must be submitted at the time of application.

<u>Duolingo</u> <u>English</u>
<u>Test</u>

The Duolingo English Test is an online English proficiency test that can be taken online, on-demand, in under an hour. The test is taken via a computer with a camera and includes a proficiency score, video interview, and writing sample which are shared with Trinity Western University when you send your results. Certified results are available within 48 hours of the test session.

Overall score 110+ with a minimum score of 95 on Literacy band

- 2. Trinity Western University has developed multiple pathways for Undergraduate students to study English at the University. Completion of these programs meets the English Proficiency requirement. These programs include U1 (University Transition) at our Langley campus and TLC (Trinity Language Center) both at Langley and Richmond campuses. Students entering via TLC will be assessed for English skills during Orientation and students will be placed in the appropriate level.
- 3. Complete three consecutive years of full-time high school or post-secondary education in English within Canada or approved countries immediately prior to enrolment at TWU. Approved countries are: Australia, Ireland, New Zealand, United States, United Kingdom, Jamaica, Hispaniola, Anguilla, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Antigua and Barbuda, Montserrat, Guadeloupe, Dominica, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Barbados, Grenada, Aruba, Curacao, Bonaire, Trinidad, Tobago, Caicos and Turks, the Bahamas and Bermuda. Or complete three consecutive years of full-time high school or post-secondary education in an internationally recognized English curriculum within the following countries immediately prior to enrolment at TWU: South Africa, Nigeria, Uganda, Ghana, Kenya, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. Please provide a school issued document confirming English as the medium of instruction. A school profile may also be required.
- 4. Complete four consecutive years of full-time high school in an accredited North-American or four consecutive years of full-time post-secondary education from a recognized institution, where English is the principal language of instruction (outside of approved countries) immediately prior to admission to TWU.
- 5. Achieve a final grade of 4 or better on the AP (Advanced Placement English Language and Composition or AP Literature & Composition.
- 6. Achieve a final grade of 3 or better on the IB English 12 A1 or A2 (HL) or a final grade of 4 or better on the IB English 12 A1 or A2 (SL) or IB English 12 B with a grade of 4 or better.
- 7. Achieve a final grade of C or better on the GCSE O-Level English Language-A.
- 8. Achieve a final grade of B or higher in six credits of post-secondary studies in English courses in an approved English-speaking country equivalent to TWU ENG103 and TWU ENG 104.

ACADEMIC ESL REQUIREMENTS

Students whose TOEFL, IELTS or CAEL scores do not meet the minimum requirement but who qualify academically to attend TWU may seek entrance to the University through the <u>Trinity Language Centre (TLC)</u> program at Trinity Western Richmond. These students must register with TLC and will be assessed regarding their English skills during Orientation, at which time they will be placed in the appropriate ESL level. Upon completion of level 5, they may enrol in a degree program without a TOEFL, IELTS or CAEL score.

INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER CREDIT EVALUATIONS

Transfer credit from international schools must be assessed by an external international credit evaluation agency. All transcripts sent to an international credit evaluation agency must be official documentation. International evaluation reports that are based on unofficial transcripts will not be accepted for transfer credit.

To avoid delays in receiving transfer credit, students should submit an international credit evaluation report during the admission process. The cost is determined by the agency.

TWU recommends the International Credential Evaluation Service (ICES) through BCIT, a member of the Alliance of Credential Evaluation Services of Canada. This agency conducts evaluations for several B.C. universities. They may be contacted at www.bcit.ca/ices
